IN THE CONSTITUENCY OF BRIGHTON PAVILION BY ICM UNLIMITED FOR THE BRIGHTON & HOVE GREEN PARTY
AND PUBLISHED BY THE BRIGHTON & HOVE GREEN PARTY ON 3 MAY 2017**

- Results are based on interviews with 1,001 residents aged 18+ across the Brighton Pavilion constituency area.
- Interviews were carried out using Computer-Assisted Telephone Interviewing (CATI).
- Fieldwork took place between 27th April and 1st May 2017.
- The data has been weighted by age, gender, ethnicity, work status, social grade and ward.
- Results are based on all respondents unless otherwise stated.
- Where results do not sum to 100%, this may be due to multiple responses, computer rounding or the exclusion of don't knows/not stated.
- An asterisk (*) represents a value of less than one half of one per cent, but greater than zero.
- The research has been carried out by ICM Unlimited in accordance with ISO 20252 and ISO 27001.
